"I'm going to graduate at the end of the summer in Human Services," David said. "I just have to do an externship and then I'll have everything complete. I can't wait to start working with people and giving back the way people have given to me."

David's determination to take what has been given to him and pay it forward to others in need is remarkable. The future is bright for him and for all those he will impact through his new human services degree.
